The Department of Music at Great Lakes University offers a Bachelor of Arts in Music. The aims and objectives of the Department of Music are to train the student in the essentials of musicianship; to guide the student in the integration of the art of living; to co-ordinate the musical activities of the student in order that all types of music, both secular and religious, be maintained at a high standard of quality; and to prepare the student for advanced professional training or a teaching career, including teaching in the public schools.

Learning Goals for the Music Curriculum are:

1. A conceptual understanding of such musical properties as sound, rhythm, melody, harmony, texture, and form and opportunities for developing a comprehensive grasp of their interrelationships as they form the cognitive-affective basis for listening, composing and performing.
2. Repeated opportunities for enacting, in a variety of ways, the roles of listener (analysis), performer (interpretation), composer (creation), and scholar (research).
3. A repertoire for study that embraces all cultures and historical periods.
4. Application of productive teaching methods within the musical classroom environment.

Requirements:

1. 180 total credits to earn a Bachelor of Arts in Music.
2. Must have completed at least 9 credit hours of study at GLU earning a minimum GPA of 2.5.
3. Meet all General Education requirements.
4. Meet Admission requirements as defined below.
5. Meet Major requirements as defined below.
6. Perform a senior recital.

Minimum criteria for admission to the major are:

1. Acceptance to the University.
2. Submission of a completed application to the Chairperson.
3. An audition in instrumental or vocal performance.
4. Acceptance to the Music Department.
